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1.0 INTRODUCTION

Mosaica Education, Inc. hereby solicits proposals from qualified proposers to provide data services to connect our seven remote sites to our datacenter in Philadelphia, PA.

The purpose of this document is to solicit bid responses from qualified vendors according to the specifications set forth herein. Mosaica Education, Inc. desires to include qualified proposers having the necessary products and expertise to satisfy this bid request. No proposer shall be included or excluded from consideration based upon any other criteria. Mosaica Education, Inc. reserves the right to confer with any and all other clients formerly or currently serviced by each bidder for the purpose of gaining insight into the work habits and performance history of any bidding vendor. It is the desire of Mosaica Education, Inc. to establish and maintain a long-term relationship with the successful bidder in order to best serve the students and stakeholders that will be serviced hereby.

Mosaica Education, Inc., on behalf of the schools, reserves the right to accept or reject, in whole or in part, all proposals submitted and/or to cancel this announcement. All contracts awarded shall be based upon the proposal(s) most advantageous to the non-profit public charter schools managed by Mosaica Education, Inc., price and other factors considered. Award may be made on the basis of the initial offers or else discussions may be held with the top proposers. All contracts are subject to the availability of funds.

2. BACKGROUND

Mosaica Education, Inc. is headquartered in New York, New York. We maintain 4 national offices in New York, Michigan, Atlanta and Ohio. Our company currently operates 31 public charter schools – 8 in Michigan, 1 in Pennsylvania, 3 in Arizona, 1 in Georgia, 1 in District of Columbia, 3 in Colorado, 1 in Atlanta, 1 in Illinois, and 11 in Ohio.

3. GOAL

Mosaica Education, Inc., on behalf of the managed-schools, hopes to achieve the following strategic vision:

- Provide the up-to-date, scalable computer hardware and software in support of the Mosaica Educational Model
- Deliver meaningful, accurate and timely advances in technology for student and teacher usage
- Eliminate duplicate work
- Collect data once, at point of origin, and ensure consistent availability
- Provide appropriate data security
- Provide the highest level of Internet-security/content-filtering
- Provide high-availability, fault-tolerant systems and services at all levels
- Focus on adopting best practices at each level of technology integration, from the Classroom to the Boardroom.

The intention of the Project Team, identified in Appendix B, is to obtain the required services and hardware with as few modifications as possible. The services and systems, as delivered, are provided to maintain Mosaica's Wide Area Network (WAN) that provides remote sites access to the services maintained and operated out

of Mosaica's corporate datacenter (such as content-filtered Internet access, e-mail, student information systems, accounting systems, et. al.). Any modifications to any phase of the project will require the approval of the Project Manager, in writing.

4. OTHER TERMS AND CONDITIONS

4.1. SUBMITTAL OF PROPOSAL

Proposals containing any bulky materials should be packaged together in appropriate packing material and submitted at one time. Proposals will be opened upon receipt and reviewed. The successful proposal(s) will be selected **on January 8, 2010.**

4.2. CHANGES AND WITHDRAWALS

Proposers may submit changes or addenda in writing, signed in original ink by the original proposal signatory, cross-referenced clearly to the relevant proposal section, prior to the closing date. Such changes must meet all the requirements for the proposal. Withdrawal notice must be in writing and received prior to the proposed selection date.

5. PROPOSAL INQUIRIES

No negotiations, decisions or actions shall be executed by any Proposer as a result of any oral discussions with any Mosaica employee or School employee. Only those transactions which are in writing, signed by the Project Manager listed in Appendix B, or senior Mosaica staff member as listed on same, may be considered as valid. Likewise, Mosaica will only consider communications from proposers that are signed and in writing, or email only from an authorized representative of the company via their corporate email system.

5.1. CALENDAR OF EVENTS

The nature of this project requires strict adherence to the project time-line. Deviations will have a significant effect on other vendors and the project as a whole. Completion beyond the scheduled date negatively affects instruction at the school and will not be tolerated. It is the responsibility of the Proposer to review and fully-understand the calendar of events, as submission of any proposal signifies acceptance of the schedule. Any approved deviations or modifications to the schedule will be made in writing by the Project Manager listed in Appendix B and published on the website.

5.2. PROPOSAL BINDING

All formal proposals shall be binding for a minimum period of ninety (90) calendar days.

5.3. CONTRACT AWARD/PURCHASE ORDER EXECUTION

Each Proposer is solely responsible for the accuracy and completeness of his/her proposal. Errors and omissions may be grounds for rejection, or may be interpreted in favor of Mosaica and the managed school. Mosaica Education, Inc. reserves the right to reject any and all proposals and to waive any informalities. The contents of the proposal offered by the successful proposer may become contractual obligations if a contract ensues or purchase order executed.

The general conditions and specifications of the RFP and the successful Proposer's response will become part of the contract/purchase order. Failure of the proposer to produce results promised in the proposal may result in the elimination of the Proposer from competition or in contract cancellation or termination.

The successful Proposer may be expected to enter into a contract with Mosaica Education, Inc. The successful Proposer will be notified in writing at award time as to the nature of the agreement. Proposers may submit its own blank standard contract terms and conditions in the response to this RFP. The submission of a blank contract is not binding in any way to any party and is merely for review in advance of possible contract offering. Contract negotiations are a complete and separate function and will not be included as part of the proposal submission.

6. SERVICE SPECIFICATIONS

Due to the ever-changing nature of educational technology, Mosaica Education, Inc. presents the following MINIMUM specifications. Where other alternatives are beneficial the vendor will make that information available for consideration.

Mosaica Education, on behalf of the managed schools, desires to utilize the best in access technologies with the highest availability. These circuits are used in the course of education and availability is critical to student learning. Provide network architecture narrative, focusing on past stability, market share, future offerings, disaster recovery briefing and service-level agreement. Current Network Diagram is attached as Appendix C.

- 6.1 **Bandwidth** – All remote sites listed under Appendix A should have the minimum connection speed indicated. Cable modem is preferred method of connection.
 - 6.1.1 6 mb download
 - 6.1.2 3 mb upload

- 6.2 **IP traffic requirements** – The solution proposed by the vendor must be capable of carrying all WAN traffic to the internet.
- 6.3 **Static IP** – Each remote site listed under appendix A should have a minimum of 1 static public IP address assigned to it.
- 6.4 **Availability / SLA** – Mosaica Education seeks the highest possible network availability. Please include your offering's network availability guarantee and SLAs (including credit computations for vendor's failure to meet monthly SLAs).
- 6.5 **Port delay** – Mosaica Education seeks a 75ms maximum port delay (1 way – national) to its PA datacenter from any of the remote sites.
- 6.6 **Hardware** – Each of the remote sites currently maintain a Fortinet firewall for security and routing purposes. If the solution that the vendor proposes requires alternate or specialized hardware to connect the remote sites to the service, that equipment, charges for the configuration of the new equipment and the price of the equipment itself must be included in the proposal.
- 6.7 **Contract Term** – The contract that would be negotiated between Mosaica and the vendor selected as a result of this RFP process is expected to have a term that would begin on July 1, 2010. Mosaica should have the ability to extend the services provided under the contract on a month-to-month basis, with no modification to the services or prices negotiated.

7.0 ***THE PROCUREMENT PROCESS***

The following is a general description of the process by which a firm will be selected to provide materials and services.

1. Request for Proposals (RFP) is issued to prospective contractors.
2. Proposals in one (1) original and two (2) copies will be received from each bidder in a sealed envelope or package.
3. Each original shall be signed and dated by an official authorized to bind the firm. Unsigned proposals will not be considered.
4. All proposals must be received by Mosaica Education, Inc. not later than the date specified in section 1.3 of this RFP.
5. At their option, the evaluators may request oral presentations or discussion with any or all bidders for the purpose of clarification or to amplify the materials presented in any part of the proposal. However, bidders are cautioned that the evaluators are not required to request clarification;

therefore, all proposals should be complete and reflect the most favorable terms available from the bidder.

6. Proposals will be evaluated according to completeness, content, and experience with similar projects, ability of the bidders and its staff, and cost.
7. Award of a contract to one bidder does not mean that the other proposals lacked merit, but that, all factors considered, the selected proposal was deemed to provide the best value to Mosaica Education, Inc. and the managed schools.
8. Bidders are cautioned that this is a request for offers, not a request to contract and Mosaica Education, Inc. reserves the unqualified right to reject any and all offers when such rejection is deemed to be in the best interest of Mosaica Education, Inc. and the managed-schools.

8.0 PROPOSAL REQUIREMENTS

The response to this RFP shall consist of the following sections:

1. Executive Summary

The executive summary shall consist of the proposal cover letter highlighting the contents of this proposal, and bearing the authorized representative's signature.

2. Corporate Background and Experience

This section shall include background information on the organization and should give details of experience with similar projects. A list of references (including contact persons and telephone numbers) for which similar work has been performed shall be included.

3. Technical Specifications Checklist

This section shall include the detailed specifications of the services included in the proposal – as outlined in the RFP. Service Level Agreements for services provided should also be detailed, as should details on service monitoring.

4. Cost Proposal

The Cost Proposal shall be submitted in a separate, sealed envelope and contain:

Non-recurring setup/installation costs (for each location)
Equipment costs (for each location, if necessary)
Monthly recurring costs (for each location)
Other costs (e.g. administrative expenses)

Total Cost – A total not to exceed cost representing the cumulative maximum non-recurring, equipment and monthly-recurring amount for all locations detailed under Appendix A must be clearly indicated under this heading.

Other Locations – Given the fact that Mosaica’s corporate and client sites change over time (new schools open, offices move, etc.), a highly desirable addition to the Cost Proposal would be some means of determining the non-recurring and monthly-recurring costs for remote sites which are not currently in existence. An example of this would be a formula which sets forth a monthly-recurring cost for data services based off the distance from a vendor’s POP (point of presence). Another would be to list estimated monthly-recurring costs for data services for several national metropolitan areas. Understanding the uncertain nature of such a formula, Mosaica would not consider the estimate included under this sub-section legally binding, but rather as an guideline to help us budget for data services for the remote site.

9.0 COST PROPOSAL/EXECUTION OF PROPOSAL

By submitting this proposal, the potential contractor certifies the following:

10.0 INSTRUCTIONS FOR PROPOSALS/QUOTES

1. **READ, REVIEW AND COMPLY:** It shall be the offeror's responsibility to read this entire document, review all enclosures and attachments, and comply with all requirements specified herein.

2. **NOTICE TO OFFERORS:**

All quotes are subject to the provisions of the Instructions for Proposals/Quotes, special terms and conditions specific to this Request for Quotes, the specifications, and the General Contract Terms and Conditions.

Mosaica Education, Inc. objects to and will not evaluate or consider any additional terms and conditions submitted with a quote. This applies to any language appearing in or attached to the document as part of the offeror's response. **DO NOT ATTACH ANY ADDITIONAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS.**

By execution and delivery of this document, the offeror agrees that any additional terms and conditions, whether submitted purposely or inadvertently, shall have no force or effect.

3. **DEFINITIONS:**

- **OFFEROR:** Company, firm, corporation, partnership, individual, etc., submitting a response to a Request for Quotes/Request for Proposals.
- **PROPOSER:** Same as Offeror.

4. **EXECUTION:** Failure to sign under EXECUTION section will render quote invalid.

5. **TIME FOR CONSIDERATION:** Unless otherwise indicated on the first page of this document, the offer shall be valid for 90 days from the date of quote opening.

6. **PROMPT PAYMENT DISCOUNTS:** Offerors are urged to compute all discounts into the price offered. If a prompt payment discount is offered, it will not be considered in the award of the contract except as a factor to aid in resolving cases of identical prices.

7. **SPECIFICATIONS:** Any deviation from specifications indicated herein must be clearly pointed out; otherwise, it will be considered that items offered are in strict compliance with these specifications, and offeror will be held responsible therefore. Deviations shall be explained in detail. **The offeror shall not construe this paragraph as inviting deviation or implying that any deviation will be acceptable.**

8. **ORDER OF PRECEDENCE:** In cases of conflict between specific provisions in this quote, the order of precedence shall be (1) special terms and conditions specific to this quote, (2) specifications, and (3) Instructions for Proposals/Quotes.

11. **ACCEPTANCE AND REJECTION:** Mosaica Education, Inc. reserves the right to reject any and all quotes, to waive any informality in quotes and, unless otherwise specified by the offeror, to accept any item in the quote. If either a unit price or extended price is obviously in error and the other is obviously correct, the incorrect price will be disregarded.
12. **REFERENCES:** Mosaica Education, Inc. reserves the right to require a list of users of the exact item offered. Mosaica Education, Inc. may contact these users to determine acceptability of the quote. Such information may be considered in the evaluation of the quote.
13. **AWARD OF CONTRACT:** Qualified quotes will be evaluated and acceptance may be made of the lowest and best quote most advantageous to Mosaica Education, Inc. and the managed school as determined upon consideration of such factors as: prices offered; the quality of the services offered; the general reputation and performance capabilities of the offerors; the substantial conformity with the specifications and other conditions set forth in the quote; the suitability of the articles for the intended use; the related services needed; the date or dates of delivery and performance; and such other factors deemed by Mosaica Education, Inc. to be pertinent or peculiar to the purchase in question. Unless otherwise specified by Mosaica Education, Inc. or the offeror, Mosaica Education, Inc. reserves the right to accept any item or group of items on a multi-item quote.

15. **TAXES:**

FEDERAL: All agencies participating in this contract are exempt from Federal Taxes, such as excise and transportation. Exemption forms submitted by the contractor will be executed and returned by the using agency.

OTHER: Prices offered are not to include any personal property taxes, or any sales or use tax (or fees).

16. **SAMPLES:** Sample of items, when required, must be furnished as stipulated herein, free of expense, and if not destroyed will, upon request be returned at the offeror’s expense. Request for the return of samples must be made within 10 days following date of quote opening. Otherwise the samples will become Mosaica Education, Inc. property. Each individual sample must be labeled with the offeror’s name, quote number, and item number. A sample on which an award is made, will be retained until the contract is completed, and then returned, if requested, as specified above.

11.0 GENERAL CONTRACT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. **DEFAULT AND PERFORMANCE BOND:** In case of default or delay by the contractor, Mosaica Education, Inc. may procure the articles or services from other sources and hold the contractor responsible for any excess cost occasioned thereby. Mosaica Education, Inc. reserves the right to require performance bond or other acceptable alternative guarantees from successful bidder without expense to Mosaica Education, Inc.
2. **GOVERNMENTAL RESTRICTIONS:** In the event any Governmental restrictions are imposed which necessitate alteration of the material, quality, workmanship or performance of the items offered prior to their delivery, it shall be the responsibility of the contractor to notify, in writing, the issuing purchasing office at once, indicating the specific regulation which required such alterations. Mosaica Education, Inc. reserves the right to accept any such alterations, including any price adjustments occasioned thereby, or to cancel the contract.
3. **TAXES:** Any applicable taxes shall be invoiced as a separate item.
4. **INSPECTION AT CONTRACTOR'S SITE:** Mosaica Education, Inc. reserves the right to inspect, at a reasonable time, the equipment/item, plant or other facilities of a prospective contractor prior to contract award, and during the contract term as necessary for Mosaica Education, Inc. determination that such equipment/item, plant or other facilities conform with the specifications/requirements and are adequate and suitable for the proper and effective performance of the contract.
5. **PAYMENT TERMS:** Payment terms are Net 30 days after receipt of correct invoice or acceptance of goods, whichever is later.
6. **CONDITION AND PACKAGING:** Unless otherwise provided by special terms and conditions or specifications, it is understood and agreed that any item offered or shipped has not been sold or used for any purpose and shall be in first class condition. All containers/packaging shall be suitable for handling, storage or shipment.
7. **STANDARDS:** All manufactured items and/or fabricated assemblies subject to operation under pressure, operation by connection to an electric source, or operation involving a connection to a manufactured, natural, or LP gas source shall be constructed and approved in a manner acceptable to the appropriate state inspector which customarily requires the label or re-examination listing or identification marking of the appropriate safety standard organization; such as the American Society of Mechanical Engineers for pressure vessels; the Underwriters Laboratories and /or National Electrical Manufacturers' Association for electrically operated assemblies; or the American Gas Association for gas operated assemblies, where such approvals of listings have been established for

the type of device offered and furnished. Further, all items furnished shall meet all requirements of the Occupational Safety and Health Act (OSHA), and state and federal requirements relating to clean air and water pollution.

8. **PATENT:** The contractor shall hold and save Mosaica Education, Inc., its officers, agents and employees, harmless from liability of any kind, including costs and expenses, on account of any copyrighted material, patented or unpatented invention, articles, device or appliance manufactured or used in the performance of this contract, including use by the government.
9. **ADVERTISING:** Contractor agrees not to use the existence of this contract, the name of Mosaica Education, Inc. as part of any commercial advertising unless approved in writing by an authorized representative of Mosaica Education, Inc.
10. **ASSIGNMENT:** No assignment of the contractor's obligations or the contractor's right to receive payment hereunder shall be permitted.
11. **CANCELLATION:** All contract obligations shall prevail for at least 90 days after the effective date of the contract. After that period, either party may cancel this contract in whole or in part by giving 30 days prior notice in writing to the other party. Such notice of cancellation, as required herein, shall be transmitted via U.S. MAIL, Certified, Return Receipt Requested. The 30 days notice for cancellation shall begin on the day the return receipt is signed and dated.
12. **QUANTITIES:** The award of a contract neither implies nor guarantees any minimum or maximum purchases thereunder.
